Back-to-School Packets:

Immunization Information Immunization information is available in ParentVUE.

Students must have required immunizations to attend school in PWCS. Check with your school or in ParentVUE to make sure your students are not missing any required immunizations. If required immunization documentation is not provided, the student will NOT be permitted to start school on Monday, August 19, 2024.

Recommended School Supplies:

- Notebook paper (college rule, loose leaf)
- Spiral or Composition Notebooks
- Pens and Pencils
- Highlighters
- Plastic BPA-free water bottles; metal water bottles NOT recommended
- Three-ring binders with plastic spines/rings (non-metal).
- Eyeglass cases should be made of hard plastic, not metal

• Note: Supplies needed for specific classes will be provided by your teacher at the beginning of the school year; however, you do not need to purchase the items listed in the syllabus if they are included in the list above.

Student Schedules

Student schedules will be available through <u>ParentVUE</u> or <u>StudentVUE</u> VUE on Wednesday, August 14th. Schedule changes will be extremely limited. Schedules were based on requests made by student last Spring. Students and families verified the course requests with an opportunity to make changes in June. Requests to change due to a change of mind will not be honored. If you believe there is an error in your student's schedule, please contact your child's school counselor. Counselors will be working to fix any errors or issues as quickly as possible. Your patience and understanding are greatly appreciated!

Bus Assignments

Bus schedules will be available in <u>ParentVUE</u> or <u>StudentVUE</u> after August 12. Reminder: Make sure to check your child's bus stop as it may be different than last year. PWCS is consolidating bus stops to help ensure students arrive to school on time. <u>Read more about transportation improvements in PWCS.</u> Bus schedules for special education, specialty programs, and Independence Nontraditional will be released the week of August 12. Middle and High School class schedules are available in <u>ParentVUE</u> or <u>StudentVUE</u> on Wednesday, August 14, 2024.

We encourage you to download the <u>Here Comes The Bus mobile app</u> that allows you to track your student's bus in real-time. If you have any questions about your child's transportation you may submit a request directly on our Transportation website: <u>Submit a request – PWCS Transportation</u> or by contacting the Transportation office at 571-402-3940.

As routes are still changing due to new student information received, please check your bus schedule again just prior to the start of school.

Student Devices

Unity Reed High School will be distributing laptops the first week of school in classes during the school day. Students need to bring their PWCS device to school every day. Please make sure it is fully charged each day before coming to school. Families are encouraged by the county to purchase insurance on their school issued device. The insurance policies are purchased through a third-party vendor. Students who did not return their laptops will not be issued a new device until the previous one is returned.

Cell Phones and Personal Devices

We believe that a cell phone on a desk or in a pocket provides too tempting a distraction for our students. When the device dings or buzzes, the minds of even the most conscientious students begin to wander. Studies tell us that it can take a brain up to ten minutes to reengage after responding to cell phone distractions. As we have all encountered, phones are not only distractions for their owners but also distractions for teachers and classmates. Governor Youngkin recently issued a ban on cell phone use during the instructional day. All PWCS schools will have restrictions on cell phones beginning on the first day of school. During class, cell phones and smart devices must be out of sight (in backpack or designated classroom cell phone area). Cell phones will not be permitted in school bathrooms. Students are permitted to use cell phones during their lunch. If you need to reach your child for an emergency during the school day, please call the school at 703-365-2900 and we will get the message to your student.

Violations for cell phone use across all PWCS High Schools are as follows:

- **1**st **offense:** Device is surrendered and returned at the end of the class period; student signs acknowledgement form.
- **2**nd **offense**: Device is surrendered, locked in the administrator's office, and returned at the end of the school day. Teacher/staff member notifies the parent/guardian.
- **3**rd **offense:** Device is surrendered and locked in the administrator's office. Student receives a referral and must complete an online module on healthy cell-phone use. Parent/guardian must retrieve the device from the school and sign an acknowledgement of further consequences form.

In alignment with Governor Glenn Youngkin's Executive Order 33, which aims to establish cell phone-free education in Virginia, PWCS will be gathering feedback from this pilot program before finalizing the wireless device guidelines and policy by January 1. Student Drop Off & Parking lot Changes:

To improve traffic flow and enhance safety during arrival and dismissal times, we have made slight adjustments to bus locations, student pick-up and drop-off, and student and staff parking. Students may be dropped off at school starting at 7:00am. The new drop off area ("Kiss and Ride") is now behind the school by way of entering Kim Graham La. Those dropping students off will enter on Kim Graham Ln and drive behind the school to the designated drop-off zone. Please follow the map for exiting on Kim Graham Ln and do not cut through the student parking lot. Please do not drop off in front of the school or near the stadium side. The lanes directly in front of the school are bus lanes. No drivers are allowed in the bus lanes during arrival or dismissal. These areas must remain clear to allow for buses to safely enter and exit.

Underclassmen will enter on Kim Graham Ln and park in their assigned spot in the rear parking lot. Seniors will enter the parking lot in front of the gym from Rixlew lane and park in their designated spot. ALL students must

purchase a parking pass from security in order to park on school grounds. Parking pass information is listed in a separate section below.

Student Entry

Students may enter the building starting at 7:00am through 2 approved entrance doors only. Student entry Doors are:

- Door 1 (Main Entrance) for Buses and Senior Parking
- Door 12 (Near Trailers) for Student Drop Off and Underclass Parking

Late to School?

After 7:30am, all late students must enter through Door 1 (main entrance) and check in at the main office.

Parking

Students who plan on driving to school must purchase a parking pass. Parking passes cost \$100. Passes will be sold during the first two weeks of school (August 19 - 30, 2024). Parking enforcement will begin on Tuesday, September 3, 2024. All vehicles, except visitors, parked at school must have a pass displayed at that time.

Seniors now have the exciting opportunity to paint their parking spots in the new senior parking lot area in front of the school by the stadium side. This initiative, inspired by student voice and feedback, aims to foster school pride while simultaneously supporting the beautification of our school campus.

Attendance Matters!

Attendance is the number one predictor of dropout and on-time graduation rates! Students who need to miss school due to illness or doctor's appointments must provide a note from a parent/guardian for the absence to be excused. Chronic absenteeism significantly impacts a student's GPA and overall school performance. Both excused and unexcused absences contribute to chronic absenteeism. When students are chronically absent, they miss critical instruction time, leading to falling behind academically. Here are some key points:

- Lower GPA: Research shows that chronic absenteeism is associated with lower grade-point averages (GPAs). Students who miss more school days tend to experience a gradual decline in their GPA.
- Early Warning Sign: High numbers of absences, especially in middle school, can serve as an early warning risk indicator for potential dropout. Addressing absenteeism early is crucial to prevent longterm academic consequences3.
- Long-Term Effects: Chronic absenteeism correlates with increased rates of high school dropout, adverse health outcomes, and poverty in adulthood.

PWCS utilizes the "<u>Attention2Attendance</u>" program to alert parents and guardians when absences, both excused and unexcused, become excessive. Students who become chronically absence will be at risk of losing sports and activities participation. As we strive to empower all students, let's prioritize attendance and create a supportive environment for academic success!

You may receive a letter regarding your students' attendance in the mail. Please understand that these notifications are to bring awareness on how much school has been missed this school year. We want to work with you to support your students' consistent daily attendance to drive academic success. If you have questions or feel you may have received a notification in error, please reach out to your student's administrator.

We understand there are unavoidable illnesses or other times when your child should remain at home. We also know that absences add up quickly, and that "showing up" is critical to your child's success in school and in life.

Parents are encouraged to minimize absences during school hours, and to plan family trips and vacations during school holidays. Requests for prearranged absences for longer than one school day, should be for extenuating circumstances and must be submitted in writing your student's administrator within a reasonable time for the school to review, approve, and assign the absence type of excused or unexcused. Free Breakfast and Lunch for Students

Free meals to all students: Breakfast and lunch will continue to be provided at no cost to students this year due to URHS receiving Title I resources for the 24-25 school year.

Outside Food/drinks

Students are not permitted to leave campus during the school day, nor use mobile ordering to have food delivered. All orders delivered to school will be discarded with no reimbursement to the student.
