W.I.N. Blocks on Maroon Days

Starting this week, students will rotate through their W.I.N. (What I Need) Blocks on Maroon Days. This dedicated time during the school day offers diverse learning experiences and additional support tailored to each student's needs. W.I.N. Blocks provide opportunities for reassessment, remediation, intervention, and enrichment. Occasionally, this time may also be used for drills, assemblies, or school-wide announcements to avoid disrupting regular instructional periods.

Emergency Preparedness Drills:

Students will be participating in required crisis management drills this school year. Students reviewed a required crisis management training video in class last week and will participate in 2 fire drills and 2 lockdown drills within the first 20 days of school. We will be conducting a fire drill and lockdown drill this week.

Bus Assignments

Bus schedules are available in <u>ParentVUE</u> or <u>StudentVUE</u>. We encourage you to download the <u>Here Comes</u> <u>The Bus mobile app</u> that allows you to track your student's bus in real-time. Student Devices

Students must bring their PWCS device to school every day. Please make sure it is fully charged each day before coming to school. Families are encouraged by the county to purchase insurance on their school issued device. The insurance policies are purchased through a third-party vendor. Cell Phones and Personal Devices

As a reminder, cell phones are not permitted during instructional time or in bathrooms, but students may use them during lunch. This policy goes into full effect this week, with outlined consequences for any violations. If you need to reach your child for an emergency during the school day, please call the school at 703-365-2900, and we will relay the message to your student. We appreciate your support in fostering a focused, engaging, and safe learning environment for all students. <u>Visit the PWCS Cell Phone and Electronic Device Guidelines webpage for more information.</u>

Violations for cell phone use across all PWCS High Schools are as follows:

- **1**st **offense:** Device is surrendered and returned at the end of the class period; student signs acknowledgement form.
- **2**nd **offense**: Device is surrendered, locked in the administrator's office, and returned at the end of the school day. Teacher/staff member notifies the parent/guardian.
- **3**rd **offense:** Device is surrendered and locked in the administrator's office. Student receives a referral and must complete an online module on healthy cell-phone use. Parent/guardian must retrieve the device from the school and sign an acknowledgement of further consequences form.

Tardies:

Students are expected to be in class on time each day. Students were excused from tardies last week, as they were getting to know where their classes are located. Unexcused tardies will begin this week. Tardy reports will be run frequently by grade-level administrators and will be counted cumulatively each quarter. Tardy sweeps will be conducted randomly and will be unannounced. Consequences for students with excessive tardies can result in detention, parent/guardian conferences, social probation, pass restrictions, behavior contracts and more.

Parking

Students who plan on driving to school must purchase a parking pass. Parking passes cost \$100 and will continue to be sold this week. Parking enforcement begins next week on **Tuesday, September 3, 2024.** All vehicles, except visitors, parked at school must have a pass displayed at that time.
